Miss, Teen & Princess RODEO QUEEN CONTEST

2015 Overview, Schedule, Rules & Entry Form

Miss, Teen and Princess Title Holders will represent the Cowboy Capital of the World by promoting our western heritage and the sport of professional rodeo while modeling goodwill and integrity. Winners will be presented with a trophy buckle, crown, and banner during the 2015 Cowboy Capital of the World PRCA Rodeo and will be expected to attend various community events throughout the year. Winner of the Miss category will receive a \$1,000 scholarship donated in memory of Glenda Doebbler by Martha Wright and Casey Doebbler. An additional \$1,000 in scholarship funds will be divided between Miss category winners. The Teen title winner will receive a \$500 scholarship donated by JB Horseshoeing and Easter Air.

Tuesday, September 8 - Mandatory Orientation / Clinic, Cowboy Church of Erath County, 6:00 pm - 9:00 pm (*Review of contest guidelines/expectations followed by clinic conducted by former rodeo queens*)

Tuesday, September 15 – Rodeo Kickoff Sponsor Gala, The N at Hard Way Ranch, 6:30 pm (All contestants will be introduced on stage and will help hand out sponsor packages)

Saturday, September 19 – Horsemanship/Horsemanship Interview, Cowboy Church of Erath Co., 9:00 am (*This portion of the judging is open to the public – family and friends are encouraged to attend*)

Saturday, September 19 - Speech/Modeling/Impromptu/Personal Interview, Cowboy Church of Erath Co., 12:00 pm (*This portion of the judging is open to the public – family and friends are encouraged to attend*)

Saturday, September 19 – Rodeo Parade & Festival, Downtown Stephenville, 5:00 pm (*All contestants will be expected to ride in the parade and attend downtown festival*)

September 25-27 - Cowboy Capital of the World Pro Rodeo Performances, Lone Star Arena Sunday, September 27 - Coronation of Miss, Teen & Princess, Lone Star Arena, 2:00 pm

(All contestants will be introduced after Grand Entry during last rodeo performance)

EXPECTATIONS:

- 1. Contestants and title winners are expected to represent the Cowboy Capital of the World Pro Rodeo in a positive and ladylike manner.
- 2. Contestants and title winners must keep in contact with Queen Contest coordinators for appearance schedules and/or advice.
- 3. Contestants and title winners must wear "Western Attire" throughout competition, during rodeo performances, and any other appearances. Attire for the Orientation, Parade, Horsemanship, Coronation and Rodeo Performances should consist of: western jeans (no holes), hat, belt, buckle, long sleeve fitted blouse, and western boots. Attire for the Sponsor Gala and Speech/Modeling events should consist of: western dress (long sleeve) or western skirt with fitted blouse and jacket, hat, belt, buckle and western boots.
- 4. Contestants and title winners are expected to be on time for all appearances.
- 5. Title winners will be expected to sign a contract outlining their responsibilities and expectations for their year as a representative of the organization.

RULES:

- 1. **Miss:** Ages 18-23, **Teen:** Ages 13-17, **Princess:** Ages 6-12 (age as of June 15, 2015)
- 2. Must be an Erath or adjoining county resident and/or student in good standing.
- 3. Never been married, had a marriage annulled or have a child out of wedlock.
- 4. Have never been, nor currently pregnant or become pregnant during reign.
- 5. No drinking, smoking, or use of drugs will be allowed.
- 6. Not been charged or convicted of a misdemeanor or felony of any kind.
- 7. Each contestant is responsible for conduct of herself, parents, and helpers.

 Any disturbance created or disrespectful behavior displayed by any of the above mentioned will result in disqualification.
- 8. Each contestant must furnish a horse for herself during horsemanship competition and any scheduled appearances where horses are a necessity.
- 9. Negative Coggins, current and up to date, required for all horses used in competition and scheduled queen appearances.
- 10. Winners will not be allowed to hold consecutive titles.

RODEO QUEEN CONTEST DETAILS / JUDGING CRITERIA:

Points Breakdown: (600 total points available)

a. Written Essay: 50b. Horsemanship: 100

c. Horsemanship Interview:50

d. Speech: 50


e. Impromptu Questions: 50

f. Personality: 100g. Appearance: 100h. Ticket Sales: 50

i. Personal Interview: 50

- **a. Written Essay (50 points):** Each contestant shall submit, along with their application, a 500-700 word essay on the topic- "The history and importance of rodeo in Stephenville, Texas The Cowboy Capital of the World".
- **b. Horsemanship (100 points):** Each contestant will be judged on horsemanship skills by performing a basic reining pattern (provided in packet) as well as making a presentation run around the arena.
- **c. Horsemanship Interview (50 points):** Judges will interview each contestant directly after the horsemanship competition. Questions may include topics such as western heritage, rodeo knowledge and any equine related topics.
- **d. Speech (50 points):** Miss and Teen contestants are required to give a 3-4 minute speech on "Rodeo and What It Means to You.". Princess contestants will give a 1-2 minute speech and may use note cards. Judging will be based on content and delivery.
- **e. Impromptu Questions (50 points):** During the speech/modeling portion, each contestant will be asked impromptu questions related to the sport of rodeo, animal welfare, current events, personality, etc.
- **f. Personality (100 points):** Contestants will be judged on personality during all appearances throughout the competition. Judges will be looking for positive attitude, sportsmanship, understanding of the sport of rodeo, passion for promoting the western way of life, etc. (50 points given during Speech/Modeling, 50 points during Horsemanship/Interview)
- g. Appearance (100 points): Contestants should wear well-fitted western styled clothing that is clean, pressed and in good condition. Judging will be based on ability to portray a genuine western image through attire and personality throughout the competition as well as photos submitted with application. Attire for the Orientation, Parade, Horsemanship, Coronation and Rodeo Performances should consist of: western jeans (no holes), hat, belt, buckle, long sleeve fitted blouse, and western boots. Attire for the Sponsor Gala and Speech/Modeling events should consist of: western dress (long sleeve) or western skirt with fitted blouse and jacket, hat, belt, buckle and western boots. (50 points given during Speech/Modeling, 50 points during Horsemanship/Interview)
- **h.** Ticket Sales (50 points): Each contestant will be given 50 tickets to sell for the Cowboy Capital of the World PRCA Rodeo. Contestant will receive 1 point per ticket sold, up to 50 total points.
- i. **Personal Interview (50 points):** Judges will interview each contestant directly after the Speeches, Modeling and Impromptu. Questions may include topics such as current events, educational goals, etc.

HORSEMANSHIP PATTERN



Ride pattern as follows:

- 1. Enter the gate (point A) at a walk and proceed to point B.
- 2. Begin at a trot, proceed to point C and stop.
- 3. Complete a 90 degree turn to the left.
- 4. Begin two figure 8's starting to the right. The first should be small and slow, the second larger and faster.
- 5. Upon completion of the final figure 8, continue through the center (point D) to point E and stop.
- 6. Back to the center of the arena (point D).
- 7. Settle your horse and then proceed at a walk to the judges. Dismount for interview.

RELEASE AGREEMENT

By my signature on this application, I hereby certify that I have read the regulations governing the MISS, TEEN and PRINCESS COWBOY CAPITAL PRCA CONTEST, and that I acknowledge these regulations.

That I hereby grant permission to the COWBOY CAPITAL PRCA RODEO to verify any information contained on my application.

That I hereby release the COWBOY CAPITAL PRCA RODEO from responsibility of injury or loss to persons or property, involving me or persons, relative to my contest appearance, sponsors, commercial and private, or the contest and all officers, directors and member individuals and groups of the contest.

That I understand the Texas Equine Law as it relates to activities at Lone Star Arena or any other equine sport facility, which states: This Texas section provides that any person, including an equine activity sponsor, equine professional, livestock show participant, or livestock show sponsor, is not liable for property damage or damages arising from the personal injury or death of a participant in an equine activity or livestock show if the property damage, injury, or death results from the dangers or conditions that are an inherent risk of an equine activity or the showing of an animal on a competitive basis in a livestock show.

That I hereby release title, claim, and rights to photographs and/or public relations materials involving me to the contest for use in contest promotion.

That I hereby certify that I have never been married, had a marriage annulled or have a child out of wedlock. I have never been, nor am pregnant now.

Failure on my part to disclose this information to local officials will automatically disqualify me from participation in any contest. Prizes of any kind, which I may receive, will be returned to the contest. The COWBOY CAPITAL PRCA RODEO will be released from any and all liability resulting from my actions.
